Dear PID Manager and Board Members,

The discovery in the Gold Nugget Museum's deep storage of some long hidden artifacts from the Paradise Irrigation District prompts us to suggest a partnership between our two organizations. Many years ago, when clearing out storage, PID donated many items to the museum. Because of space limitations, we have rarely shown them. They have been stored away out of the sight, as good as lost to the public. We propose that we join forces to exhibit those artifacts and make the community aware of PID's history.

We suggest that the PID sponsor the placement of a small building on our grounds, furnished to replicate an early PID office. This would house the following objects in our collection: Mr. Bille's desk and typewriter, the large addressing machine, several Dictaphones that used tube recording equipment, maps of the district from different eras, samples of the types of pipes used by the district over the years, and documents from the early days of the district's history.

This would benefit the PID by informing the community about the early reasons for building the dam, the way the dam was built, and the evolution of the piping systems. The museum has thousands of visitors each year; many of them are new to Paradise. With the new exhibit, the public will learn about the library see the connection between local water issues and the district's history.
