Paradise Irrigation District Lake Committee Meeting Minutes, February 14, 2018

Directors Present: Bill Kellogg, Marc Sulik

Steve Rodowick opened the meeting by informing the Committee that Paradise Park and Recreation District (PRPD) passed a resolution in support of Proposition 68; Park, Environment, and Water Bond Act (June 2018). This act, if passed on the June ballot, would authorize \$4 billion in general obligation bonds for State and local parks, environmental protection projects, and flood protection projects. Representing PRPD, Steve made a request to the PID Board of Directors for a similar resolution of support to be passed in support of Proposition 68.

1. Thad Walker from the Butte County Resource Conservation District was not present at the meeting, so there was no update given on the potential of a trail system connecting Magalia Reservoir with Paradise Lake.
2. Project Updates.
 - a. Construction projects- Greg reported that the new bulletin board/kiosk has been installed at Paradise Lake. Informational bulletins and other pertinent lake activity information will be posted.
 - b. Paradise Lake recreation activities- Greg noted that lake permit sales were up in January 2018 due to the fair weather. He said it was, "The best January ever."
 - c. Shaded Fuel Project- Greg stated that the Little Butte Creek Shaded Fuel Project is ongoing. There will be a couple of tours of the project to be made available in March, possibly on March 22nd. Tours will be coordinated thru the Butte County Fire Safe Council and CDF.

There was a side discussion regarding designated Burn Days in Butte County. Jim made note that for permitted burn sites such as the WTP, that a telephone call always is to be made to the Butte County Air Quality Management District and if it is not a permissible burn day, that a discussion with a BCAQMD inspector has to occur.

Kieran noted that SPI will be starting timber harvesting on its land and will start up near Lovelock and work their way down Doon Grade and Coutolenc Road and should reach the Paradise Lake area around mid-May.

3. Annual Kids Fishing Day (KFD) 2018-
 - a. Jim noted that the full grant of \$3,000 was awarded to PID from the Butte County Fish and Game Commission for the purchase of trout for planting in Paradise Lake prior to KFD. \$2,500 was awarded in 2017. The trout plant for KFD is planned for April 18th just ahead of the event. 2,000 lbs. of trout will be planted into Paradise Lake. Two other trout plants of 2,000 lbs. each will occur later in May.

- b. A couple of new booths will be added this year. A booth for kids to color a wooden fish is to be donated and sponsored by Blue Team Realty of Paradise. Another booth is proposed to be staffed by PID Directors so the public can meet and ask questions of the Directors during the day. Northern Recycling and Waste Services provides a means at the Cove Recycling Center in Paradise to “Save a Can, Buy a Fish” campaign that is raising money to help pay for the trout plants for KFD. Jim also brought up an idea of to give out free day use pass for Paradise Lake to any kids that volunteer to work on KFD.
 - c. Dave noted that since there was no interest from students at Paradise High school for the proposed KFD poster project, he has solicited and gotten interest from students at Ridgeview High School. Dave stated that the posters most likely will not be ready prior to this year’s KFD, but next year they should be. Dave also volunteered his services as a photographer on KFD and noted that he also has his FAA drone pilots license that could be used for photos as well.
 - d. Jim stated that the PID budget for 2018 for KFD is \$8,000 and he would like to request a budget of \$10,000 for the 2019 year. With a full \$3,000 grant from Butte County F&G, a total budget of \$13,000 could be made available for next year’s KFD.
4. Water Supply- Since the previous Water Supply Committee was eliminated by Board action, Water Supply discussions and responsibilities have been assigned to the Paradise Lake Committee. A graph showing the current water level at Paradise Reservoir was provided to the Committee. Kevin noted that such a graph will be provided to the Committee at every subsequent meeting. Kevin also noted that the dam at Paradise Reservoir is considered by the State to be an Extremely Hazardous Dam, and the dam at Magalia Reservoir is considered a Hazardous Dam. Based on those designations, Inundation studies are required by the State for the areas downstream of the dams. Kevin suggested that an informational article regarding the dam designations and the required inundations studies be included in the next PID Water Talk newsletter.
